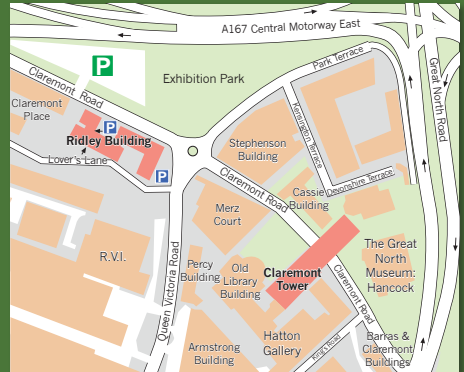


**Talks start at 7.00pm and finish by 8.15pm.
